Bible Exegesis BE 201

Course Description

An introduction to Biblical Hebrew and Greek languages. An emphasis on the consistent Literal Grammatical Historical method of interpretation also known as the consistent normal or plain reading of scriptures. Students will learn about the importance of biblical exegesis and will be introduced to the process of rightly dividing the word of truth. In addition, students will learn how to address variations that are in our English Bibles.

Bible Hermeneutics BH 101

Course Description

Study of principles of method to make a student an independent scholar of the Bible.

Bible Theology I BT 101

Course Description

This course is to identify and explain the Doctrines in the Sacred Scriptures, (The Bible). "The course is in no sense intended to be a treatise on Systematic Theology" (MBT). A limited number of the most vital and practical doctrinal themes have been chosen, and an attempt has been made to adapt these brief discussions to the needs of the Course. We will reference The Bible to define each of these Doctrines and to discuss its use and application in understanding The Bible and Daily Walk.

Bible Theology II BT 102

Course Description

This course is to identify and explain the Doctrines in the Sacred Scriptures, (The Bible). "The course is in no sense intended to be a treatise on Systematic Theology"i (MBT). A limited number of the most vital and practical doctrinal themes have been chosen, and an attempt has been made to adapt these brief discussions to the needs of the Course. The students will learn about the character and universality of sin, and that they are victorious over sin and death through salvation in Christ Jesus. They will be introduced to the New Testament Church; particularly its purpose, commission, service, stewardship, organization, ordinances, and rewards. The course concludes with an introduction to the end times theology. These areas cover the Tribulation, Great Tribulation, Millennial Kingdom, and New Heaven and Earth.

Church History CH 101

Course Description

A study of the major movements within the black church from its earliest inception to the twenty-first century and how its history has influenced current church practices. This course will provide a survey of significant events with a focus on the development of theology.

Great Commission Survey

EM 102

Course Description

This course is a study of evangelism and missions in which we will discuss and develop the biblical foundation and a practice solution to live out the command and commission of God. We will examine previous movements, methods, of both Personal and Church Evangelism, Outreach, and Missions. It is our desire to review and identify all New Testament commission related to the Great Commission.

Living God's Story

BLS 202

Course Description

Students will survey the redemptive story of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation, emphasizing how that story shapes the Christian's worldview and affects life decisions. The course Living God's Story is a guide to help students understand, experience and live out the Great Story of the Bible. Learning about the entire Great Story is a large undertaking, but knowing God as our creator and redeemer makes the effort exciting and invaluable.

New Testament Survey

Course Description

A general survey of all New Testament books and gain broad understanding of their historical contexts.

Course Description

A general survey of the Old Testament, highlighting its organization, overall themes, historical context, and major events, as well as key words, names, and places mentioned in each book. Spiritual formation is a graduation requirement for all DBTI students and continues through Fall and Spring Semesters. Course Description

Topics in Biblical Counseling is a survey of topics involved in biblical counseling based on the Scriptures.
